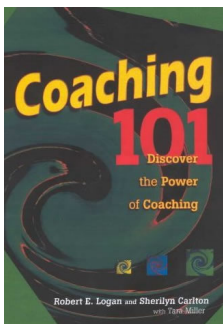

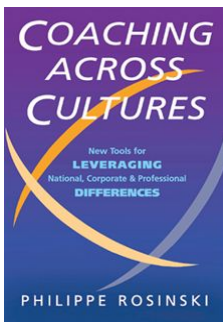

**Coaching 101:** Discover the Power of Coaching.

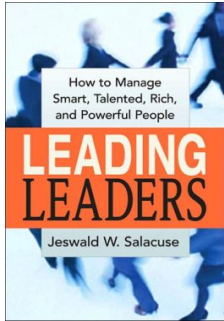

**Coaching Across Cultures:** New Tools for Leveraging National, Corporate, and Professional Differences.

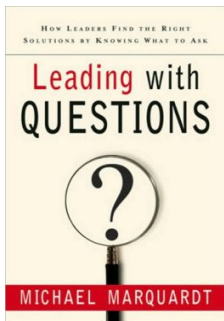

**Leading Leaders: How to Manage Smart, Talented, Rich, and Powerful People.**

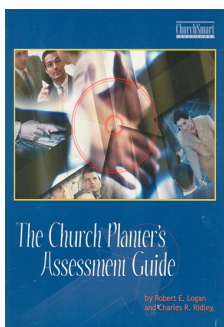

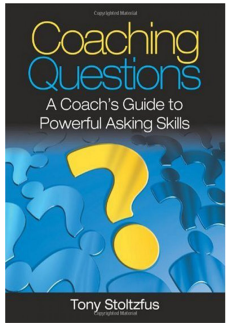
**Leading with Questions: How Leaders Find the Right Solutions By Knowing What To Ask.**

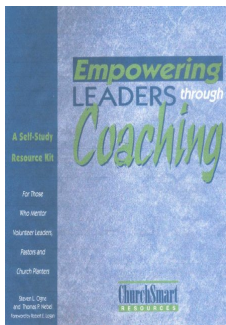
**The Church Planter's Assessment Guide.**
